This term seems to have absolutely flown by in a whirl of activity. School is gradually beginning to feel more 'normal' and the children have settled back into their routines and work as well as reestablishing friendship groups. Breakfast Club and After School Club for working parents are once again thriving and children have been enthusiastic about signing up for the range of extra-curricular activities.

Our curriculum offer for P.E. has been strengthened throughout the school with specialist providers working with various classes. These including Michelle Rochester from Dance Umbrella offering choreography, football coach Martin Phillips, Somerset Cricket and Bath Rugby.







Additionally, when weather allows, there are lunchtime Rounders and Athletics clubs and an external provider has been offering Orienteering. The children are pro-active at playing a variety of ball sports at lunchtimes in addition to fully using the play equipment, sandpit and whizzing around on scooters. It is fantastic to see children enjoying the outdoor space and keeping fit after for so long living with restrictions.

#### Maple Class

We have loved being back in school after the Easter holidays. For history, we have been learning about the Stone Age to Iron Age using our core texts, 'Stig of the Dump', and 'Stone Age Boy'. The children have enjoyed creating their very own 'Stone Age' stories based on the text. We've made links to 'Rocks and Soil' in science and we've made our own fossils using salt-dough after learning the fossilisation process. To deepen our understanding of soil we created our own compost!
