Dear Parents/Carers

The culture of Reading For Pleasure is really embedded within school and we can really see the confidence this is giving children in accessing the wider currículum. Please encourage you r child to take part in the Summer Reading Challenge at your local library. We shall celebrate this and any summer holiday 'Doodling' on Doodle Maths in Term 1 next year.

As it gets towards the end of the summer term, we have seen an increase in incorrect school uniform. We understand fully that July is perhaps not ideal for buying new clothing and shoes before children inevitably grow over the summer. However please check that uniform is correct when purchasing over the summer. See information in box below. I shall be enforcing the uniform expectations from September and teachers will be vigilant.

Uniform: Longvernal logo polo shirt, Longvernal logo sweatshirt or cardigan. Black skirt, black shorts or black trousers. PE: Longvernal P.E.shirt, black standard P.E.shorts (not cycling shorts) or black joggers (not leggings) with trainers or daps. If colder weather, school black fleece or school sweatshirt or cardigan NOT casual or fashion logo hoodies or sweatshirts. School footwear: black shoes (not boots, ankle boots or trainers). Jumpsuits are NOT school uniform. I know some shops make these in green gingham check but they are not suitable for school as they need to be fully removed in order to use the toilet. School skirts should reach the knee and should not be 'tube' style as these are not suited to daily activities such as Move a Mile and playing on the play equipment.

If hair is long enough to be tied up it should be, for health and safety reasons. No jewellery except plain stud earrings. No watchers that are internet –linked or have a camera.

I would like to wish our Year 6 children and any other children moving on to pastures new all the very best in their ongoing educational journeys.

Thank you to all our family and friends for your ongoing support. I feel very privileged to be Head of Longvernal working among such a warm community.

In the light of recent concerning events with young people in our communities, please be alert to keeping children safe over the summer-both when out and about in the streets and local parks and also online.
