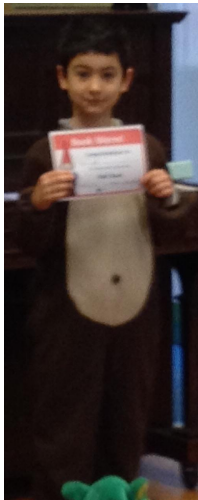
Doodle Maths
