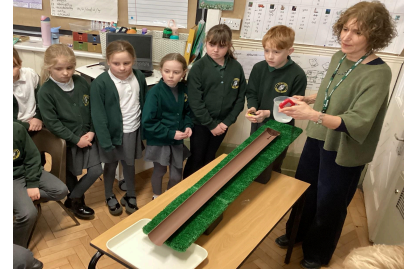




Happy Friday! We have officially reached the midway point of the school year. It is incredible to see how much the children have grown and learned since September.

### **PTFA Funding Update**

A huge thank you to all parents and carers for their continued support of the PTFA this year.

Thanks to the funds raised through our events and activities, we have already been able to provide a number of valuable resources and experiences for the children.

**So far this year**, PTFA funds have been used to provide:

- A new selection of reading books for EYFS and KS1, supporting early literacy and a love of reading.
- A theatre production for the whole school, including a workshop, giving pupils an engaging and enriching experience.
- Four scooters and helmets for use by older children.
- A new scooter rack, helping to store equipment safely.
- Donation to each class to purchase fun games/activities for the classroom.

**Throughout the rest of the year**, we have committed PTFA funds to:

- Covering the cost of a coach for one school trip per class, helping to keep trips accessible for families.
- Funding new starter rucksacks and water bottles for the new intake of Reception children.
- Funding Year 6 leavers' hoodies as a special end-of-primary keepsake.
- Supporting Bikeability training for Year 6 pupils.
- Funding a Life Skills course for Year 6, helping to increase pupils confidence and independence as they transition to secondary school.

Alongside this, the PTFA is busy planning more fun events for the coming months, including an Easter Fun Run, another Silent Disco, and a Break the Rules Day — all of which help raise vital funds while creating memorable experiences for the children.

We are always keen to welcome new volunteers and fresh ideas, whether you can help at events, support behind the scenes, or have suggestions for future fundraising activities. Any time or ideas you can offer are hugely appreciated and make a real difference.

Thank you once again to everyone who has volunteered, donated, or supported PTFA events so far this year. Your continued support helps us enhance school life for all our children.
