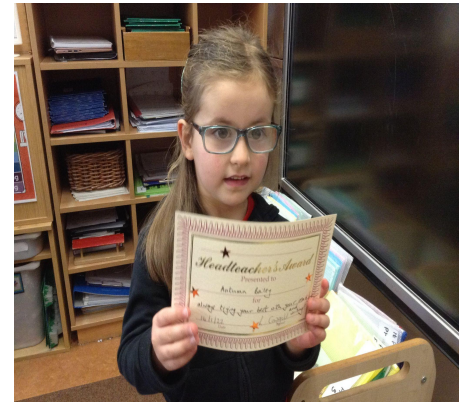
### Certificates of the week
