- **Jewellery** - Please can we remind you that no bracelets or necklaces should be worn in school. And for reasons of health and safety, only a single stud earring is permitted in each ear.
- **Nursery Consultation** - Thank you to everyone who put forward their point of view about the possibility of having a nursery on-site. The Consultation period has now closed.

Support for Children and Young People with SEND in Bath & North East Somerset

What is it?

The Rainbow Resource Scheme is part of the local offer from Bath & North East Somerset Council for families of children and young people (aged 0-25) with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND).

It provides:

- ✔ A free membership card giving access to concessions and discounts at participating venues and activities.
- ✔ A discreet way to recognise additional needs, helping staff and venues offer the right support
- ✔ A central hub of information about local services, activities, health and education support for families.

Who can apply?

Children and young people aged 0-25 who live in Bath & North East Somerset and who:

- Have an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP), or
- Receive Disability Living Allowance (DLA), or
- Have a long-term diagnosed health condition, or
- Receive Band C Inclusion Support Funding

Why join?

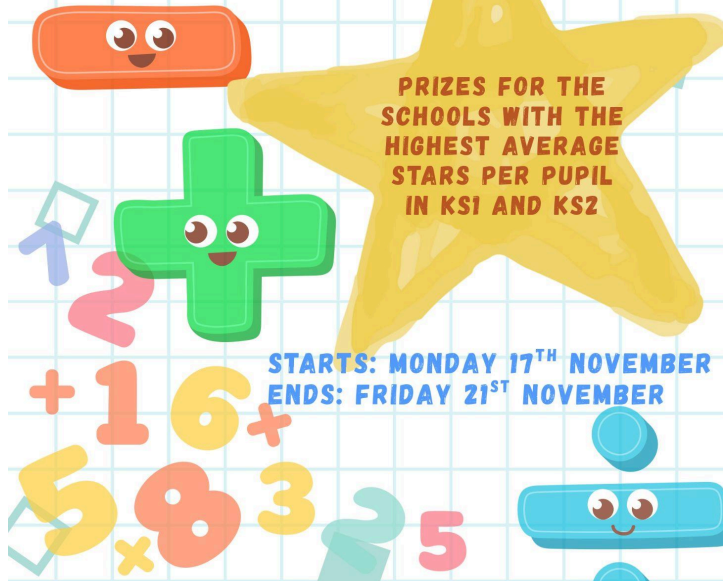
