Dentist Visit

On Thursday, Maple and Cherry Class had a visit from a dentist. They learnt all about Tilly the tooth and how she stays healthy. The children learnt that it is best to clean your teeth twice a day, with a pea-sized amount of toothpaste, and that it is better not to rinse out your mouth with water afterwards because that washes the fluoride away. They also learnt how to make good food and drink choices for your teeth, and how to replace sugary foods and drinks with healthier choices, such as choosing cereal with no added sugar.
