He will read some passages from his book, discuss the illustration process and answer any questions the children may have. SEND NEWS:

We wanted to take a moment to reassure you about any reports you may receive following support or assessments such as Speech and Language Therapy (SALT), Occupational Therapy (OT), or a dyslexia screening.

These reports are designed to help us better understand your child's strengths and any areas where they may benefit from additional support. It is very common for the information in them to feel detailed or, at times, a little overwhelming, so please be assured that you are not expected to know what to do with this information on your own.

If you receive a report and are unsure about the next steps, or would like help understanding the recommendations, we strongly encourage you to speak with your child's class teacher. A meeting can then be arranged to go through the report together, explain what it means in school, and discuss practical strategies that can be used both in the classroom and at home to support your child.

We value working closely with parents and carers, and these conversations help ensure that everyone feels confident and supported in helping your child thrive.

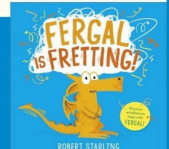

KEEPER OF THE EARTH
Light in the Shadows



A thrilling, fast paced, sci-fi adventure novel for ages 8+.

Saving Earth wasn't on Lexie's birthday to-do list. But when she stumbles upon a mysterious Orb in her local toyshop, the world as she knows it is thrown into chaos. Lexie's greatest challenge is not just preventing an impending disaster, but uncovering the truth about a past she can't quite remember. With time running out, Lexie must trust in her own instincts and find the courage to face the unknown or risk losing everything she holds dear.

What will children enjoy about his book?

Apart from the thrill of the chase and excitement of a battle between good and evil, readers will laugh and maybe shed a tear or two (nothing too scary). They will meet new characters along the way and join Lexie as she begins to understand who she really is. Themes of love, loss, friendship and clever tenacity resonate throughout the story from beginning to end.

What will happen in the assembly?

Being an author and an illustrator will make my visit extra special. I will show the children a short video highlighting my illustrations, read from my book and then answer questions.

How to get the book

Parents and guardians will be able to buy a signed and personalised copy of the book from me at the school. I will have copies on the day selling at £8.99 cash or card. Alternatively, books can be purchased in advance via my website (see link below). Don't worry if you can't purchase the book on the day. You can order from my website and I will deliver signed copies to the school the following week.

I have worked as an animator & vfx artist on children's shows such as Dr Who & Sarah Jane Adventures for the BBC, Shane the Chef as well as The Pirates feature film at Aardman. More recently, I've returned to my passion for writing and drawing and now create my own stories for children from 8 and above. I also hold a current Enhanced DBS certificate.
