On Thursday, our school's eco-team had a workshop with Paula Malone from Energy Sparks to explore ways in which we can reduce our carbon footprint as a school. The children had some brilliant ideas and are in the process of planning our first 'Power Down' afternoon. Are there any ways that you could save energy at home?

As some of you know, we have been running an intergenerational project with some of our Year 5 children and Cholwell House. As part of this, our Year 5 children in Oak Class were invited to create some fantastic portraits of the King. These were displayed at Cholwell House's Art Exhibition on Thursday alongside some of the resident's own creations. This was a great community event and we were honoured to have been involved.



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On Thursday Cherry Class had a special visitor. Gabriel's mum came in to tell us how Easter is celebrated in Lithuania and to teach us some Lithuanian. We learnt that it is not traditional to eat chocolate eggs for Easter in Lithuania. Instead they eat chicken eggs and dye them in different colours. In class we had a go at dying eggs using natural dyes. The children chopped beetroot to make a purple dye and red cabbage to make a blue dye. Then we boiled them up and added a bit of vinegar before we added our hard boiled eggs. We also boiled up some onion skins, turmeric and paprika to make brown, yellow and red dyes. It was so exciting to see the results! Aciu Ramune! (Thank you Ramune)


