How to Plant your Bulbs

Clutton Horticultural Society has donated

1 Hyacinth Bulb and
2 Daffodil Bulbs per pupil
so 2 separate pots are needed

- 1. Put a layer of compost in the bottom of a pot. (Make sure it has a drainage hole at the bottom.)
- 2. Stand the bulbs on the compost.
- 3. Add more compost, just leaving the tips of the bulbs uncovered and then water them.
- 4. Bury the pot in the garden or put it in a cool, dark place outside, (you could put it in a black plastic bag) and leave it there until it starts to grow. Keep checking it, then let it out into the light to flower just before the Spring Bulb Show.
