I wanted to share some information regarding what has happened over the last week and the next steps moving forward.

Following the temporary closure of The Cabin at the end of last week, we realised the need to organise wraparound care for our children to ensure that parents had the option of provision before and after school. This was in consultation with the Trust and the Local Authority. I want to thank all of our staff who took this project on at short notice and worked very hard throughout last weekend to ensure we were able to provide this. At that point we had no idea when The Cabin would be allowed to reopen and although we understand that it now has, we have decided to keep our wraparound provision going throughout Term 6, due to the positive feedback we have had from many parents and their desire for this to continue.
