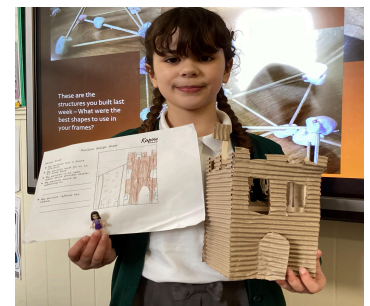
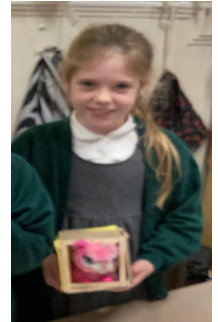

SYCAMORE CLASS - DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY PROJECT

Sycamore class have been having fun over the last 3 weeks designing and making their own pavilions. Having studied 'real life' pavilions, they were then tasked with creating their own pavilion with the brief that their pavilion must be able to provide shelter for hot and wet weather. We are super impressed with the results - it's amazing what you can create from lolly sticks, string and a glue gun!



For the past few weeks Sycamore class have been looking at pavilions in DT. First, we made marshmallow and cocktail stick structures. We did that to find out which structures were stable and which structures were not because then we could use those shapes in our own pavilions. Then we designed our pavilion on a piece of paper and also made a birds eye view plan of where the pavilion would go on a bigger piece of paper. After that we made our pavilions with a hot glue gun, a mini hacksaw, lollipop sticks, corrugated cardboard and some coloured card. All of Sycamore's pavilions are very unique and colourful. Finally we did an evaluation on how we could make our pavilions better and if we could have used a different shape. It was a very fun project.

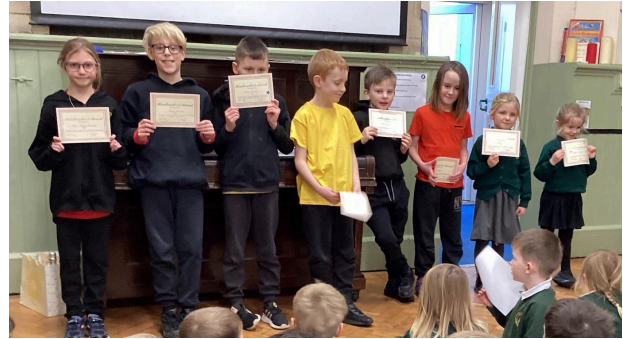
