Our Forest School area at the back of school is ever changing. School children are not allowed to play in this area at break or lunch times. pick up times do not enter this area to ensure it is safe for everyone to use in their Forest School sessions and so that nothing gets damaged that has been created. As well as this, the school children know that they are not to play on or roll down the green slopes in front of the pods, which is again for their own safety. Please can we ask anyone dropping off or picking up that they ensure that any preschool children that accompany them are not on these slopes.

There are increasing numbers of families arriving at school late in the mornings. Please can we remind you that the school day begins at 8.45am. This gives your child 5 mins to get to class for registration at 8.50am. From Monday the gate will be closed at 8.50am each morning and after that, you will need to buzz to be let in. Your child will then receive a late mark in the register.

We hope you all have an enjoyable long weekend with the Bank Holiday Monday. Please remember that there is another NEU strike day on Tuesday, which means that children in Year 1 and Year 5 will not be in school.

- **Dinner Menu Choices** Please ensure bookings are made by Thursday for lunches for the following week. Unfortunately, options can no longer be changed after this day.
