Dear Parents/Carers

Re: Year 6 leavers arrangements: the programme is subject to Covid guidance from UK government.

We are delighted to be able to confirm arrangements to celebrate the end of your child's learning journey at Clutton Primary School; this includes a 3 day activity programme in lieu of this year's residential camp.

We have booked the following activities for the 7th-9th July (in school, children will be spending this time with their new class teacher). The three days we have planned will enrich wider curriculum learning and will form the basis of class work when children return to school.

Wednesday 7th July - Trip to Bristol Harbourside to include boat trip and M Shed visit. Children have studied Bristol as a local history study, and the slave trade. **Abolition Afloat:** This boat trip is a unique way for children to engage with this challenging history, this trip will enrich the children's study of Bristol's involvement with Transatlantic Slavery. They will have an opportunity to view areas of Bristol related to this history, and explore it from the perspective of a ship's boy. We will use public transport for this trip.

Thursday 8th July - Longleat. This will build on children's existing scientific knowledge around animals, habitats, life cycles and adaptations.

Friday 9th July - Hamburger Hill outdoor pursuits, Laser tag for the morning followed by Forest school/BBQ during the afternoon at school. These sessions will be focusing on working collaboratively as a team and physical and mental wellbeing.

The approximate cost for the three days would be £75, we will confirm once we have booked tickets. There will be an option for staggered payments, although the full balance must be paid by the 5th July (the usual pupil premium discounts will apply). To ensure costs remain as low as possible, we have booked the Trust minibus - a small contribution will be added to cover the cost of petrol.

Children will require a packed lunch for days 1&2 and we will be contacting you with dietary requirements for day 3. These trips will be led by Mrs Morris, Mrs Appleyard and another adult TBC.

Should behaviour be of a concern, we will be asking parents to accompany the trip.

Due to the educational focus of the trips, children who do not attend the activity days will be expected to be in school.



Year 6 Drama Production

Mrs Shaw, a parent and secondary school drama teacher, has offered to come and work with the children to produce an abridged version of The Tempest. She will be working with the children over the forthcoming weeks. We are hoping that this will lead to a performance in July, which we hope to be able to invite you all to watch. As with the activities this is dependent on Covid guidance. Watch this space.....

Again, we hope to be able to invite parents to join us for a special leavers assembly to celebrate and say goodbye and good luck to our Year 6 children. This will be on Friday 23rd July at 9.15am.
