## **RESIDENTIAL VISIT 2023 – Mendip Outdoor Pursuits**

The coach is due to pick us up at 9.50am on Wednesday, 22<sup>nd</sup> March. <u>Please bring</u> your child to school at the usual time (8:40-8:50am) and drop their luggage off in the school hall. Children will then go to their classroom as usual.

We will eat the pre-ordered lunch upon arrival at the centre at 11:45am and this will be followed by a tour of the site. After this, the children will go straight to their first activity without checking into their room; therefore **they need to be dressed in suitable clothes for their first activity which will be archery active or orienteering (long sleeved top and trousers please).** Please ensure your child is dressed appropriately for the British weather!

Any medication they require for the week should be handed to myself, Mr Wellington or the school office. (Please do not pack medication in your child's suitcase.)

Please remember your child requires bedding. This can be a sleeping bag or duvet as well as their pillow. An extra blanket may be appreciated by your child if they feel the cold. It is very useful if children pack spare plastic bags to put wet/muddy clothes in. Just remember that children will be responsible for carrying ALL of their own luggage so small wheeled suitcases/bags are preferential.

Your child will not need to bring any cash. A sensible amount of sweets or snacks for the evening are permitted. We expect to arrive back to school at approximately 14.00 on Friday afternoon therefore you can collect your child at the usual pickup time of 15:20.

Being a spring residential, it is likely that children will need a full range of clothing. Several of the activities will need long sleeves and trousers for Health and Safety reasons and during the evening/night the children will need a hoodie and coat. Of course, there is also a fair chance of rain, so a waterproof jacket would also be required.











This list is compiled as a guide to what is required. We hope that you will not need to make any special purchases. This is an educational trip on a rural site so all clothing should be comfortable and practical.

Please limit your luggage to one **medium-sized** holdall or suitcase - **remember we are** only away for two nights.
