Dear Parents/Carers

First of all, a huge 'Thank you' for your patience and helpfulness with the safe return to school this term. It has certainly presented some challenges and no doubt more to come so your support is much appreciated. I seem to keep saying it but it truly has been a joy to see the children enjoying being back playing with their friends and settling down to learning really effectively. Behaviour has generally been exceptional, especially learning behaviours in class. I would like to thank you for the fact that children have returned to school in correct uniform and are bringing in school P.E. kit and Forest gear as required. Please remember to name all uniform and kit to help us return it to the correct owner. From Term 2 the weather will no doubt turn colder so please provide your child with gloves, warm socks, warm clothing and waterproofs as feeling cold can spoil a Forest School session for a child. Please note: on wet days when children need to go straight in to class, they still enter through the same gates as usual according to their 'bubble.'

We may not have an adult on every entrance to greet children as we do on a dry day simply because adults need to be in classrooms to receive children and cannot be in two places at once; thank you for your understanding. Talking of the weather, if your child is cold in class as classrooms are trying to be as 'airy' as possible, they may wear base layers. If you have any concerns around such issues, I ask you to speak direct to the school by phone or email rather than discuss on social media, as outlined in the home-school agreement.

I hope you have had a chance to view the regularly updated news on the class pages on the website and that the virtual 'Welcome' meetings gave you an insight into your child's learning this year and expectations around this and how best to support your child at home. Likewise, I hope you and your child have been able to embrace the different approach to homework under Covid with more focus on online tasks. If you have difficulty accessing electronic homework please let us know so that we can find a way to help. If you have any questions which were left unanswered at the 'Welcome' meeting, please email these to me kbazeley@longvernalschool.com and we shall try and compile a FAQs link on the website. I understand that it is harder to touch base with your child's teacher currently but please remember that if you contact them by email they will respond although it will probably be after the working day. Our new 'Values' sign is now up and we are embedding these with the weekly awards. Celebration Assemblies are now within classes but children still have the opportunity to be 'Reader of the Week' and climb the Golden Ladder to borrow a book. Student Council and Equalities (E Team) reps have been elected and now that we have settled back into routines these will begin to meet within 'bubbles.'

You will have received an appointment slot for an online or phone parent meeting. Please be aware that teachers will have to stick to time in the way they would have on a regular parents' evening. Thank you for your understanding with this. Currently we are not able to take the children out on trips. As you know, Longvernal usually strives to carry out several trips per year to broaden the children's horizons, building 'cultural capital.' We are seeking to ensure the children 'catch up' academically from learning missed last academic year and teachers are seeking to use learning time effectively such that whilst prioritising the basics of Phonics, Reading, Writing and Maths children don't miss out on the wider curriculum. With this in mind, we are investigating ways of bringing experiences to the children if they can't go to the experiences on a trip. This could be with visiting workshops (socially distanced in bubbles in a large space) linked to Humanities, Science, the Arts or R.E. Letters related to these will come out in due course. I hope that you will agree that such experiences are of value in the way that trips would usually be and be prepared to contribute to any costs involved to make these possible.

I am delighted that the after school sports clubs run by Sporting Family Change are being enjoyed by all although I am sorry that we were unable to offer this to more children and I realise that some children will have been disappointed. We are hoping to offer a football club in the coming weeks and are still seeking to source other means of providing after school clubs safely whilst teachers are unfortunately unable to offer these.

The PTA has been re-named PTFA (Parents Teachers Friends Association). The PTFA has been thinking creatively to find ways in which they can continue to raise funds and provide exciting events for the children amid the current restrictions. They regularly update their Facebook page and additionally are posting information on their page on the website. Their information is to be found under the tab 'News and Events.' The PTFA is keen to recruit new members so please contact them if you wish to get involved.

Lastly, prior to school closure in March, many teachers provided children with reading books including some brand new ones from our Read,Write,Inc scheme. Several of you have returned these- thank you. If you have any books belonging to school at home, can I ask that you kindly return these? Thank you for your help with this. I hope the rest of Term 1 continues as positively as it has begun and I wish you a restful half term.

OAK CLASS


