<p>Consistent groups reduce the risk of transmission by limiting the number of pupils and staff in contact with each other to only those within the group.</p> <p>It is recognised that, particularly with younger children, social distancing will be difficult or impossible. Younger children will not be able to maintain social distancing, and it is acceptable for them not to distance within their group</p> <p>Children in EYFS are allowed to access continuous provision using easily and frequently cleaned resources.</p> <p>We will make adaptations to the classroom to support distancing where possible. This will include seating pupils side by side and facing forwards, rather than face to face or side on.</p> <p>We will remove unnecessary furniture out of classrooms to make more space.</p>	<p>Owing to the very small numbers on roll for pre-school and main school (36 in total) the whole site will be considered one bubble.</p> <p>Jan '21 During the third national lockdown only vulnerable and key worker children are attending school, continuing to be considered as one bubble.</p> <p>Feb '21 Owing to a widening of the government description of vulnerable and key worker children during the third national lockdown, we have had 16 out of 26 children attending school full time.
