School Uniform

After Easter pupils are welcome to wear Summer uniform to school. This consists of purple summer dress with socks (not tights), grey shorts, shorts leaved shirt and tie. Please can we remind parents that black school shoes (not trainers) must be work. Children who wear shirts must wear them tucked in and a tie must be worn. We are starting to see school uniform standards slide and will be enforcing the correct wearing of school uniform in the Summer term.

Large headbands and jewellery <u>are not part</u> of school uniform. Small stud earrings may be worn but must be removed by your child for PE.

Extremes of hairstyle are not permitted e.g. nothing shorter than a number 2, unnatural colours or hair extensions. A break of these rules may result in the pupil having a loss of playtime, being isolated in school or sent home. The Headteacher, with the support of the Governing Body, reserves the right to ask any child considered inappropriately dressed to return home and dress in the appropriate manner.

Year 1 Learning

A £16 billion proposal to build a huge solar power station in space is being explored by the government, the science minister has said. George Freeman, an investor who was appointed minister for science, research, and innovation last year, said his department had met with a group that wants to develop a solar farm in orbit, which would beam renewable energy back to Earth. It is thought that by the mid-2040s, it should be able to deliver about 30GW of continuous power straight from space.
