
#### Maypole Dancing

Requests to join the Scouts and Girlguiding Things to talk about at home ... groups have reached the highest levels for over 80 years. The Scout Association said nearly 90,000 young people across the UK are currently on waiting lists and Girlquiding has nearly 55,000 people waiting for a place. Simon Carter, national spokesperson for the Scout Association, said that in the last year, membership has grown by 16%. "We have not seen this level of growth since the Second World War." he added. "Lockdown was a grim period for young people. They couldn't go anywhere. There is now more zeal for the outdoors."
