
Our star of the week this week is Milo. He has been super helpful and thoughtful this week!

Photographer

We have a photographer booked on Monday 14th November. If Monday is not your child's usual day, then you are more than welcome to attend - please let a member of staff know in advance so we can organise this. If your child usually attends nursery on a Monday then you can drop them off as usual and we will take them over during their session here. Sibling photos with children at St. Johns can also be arranged - please let a member of staff know so that the correct teacher can be informed.

Changes to funded hours

Please note, any permanent changes to your child's funded hours need to be confirmed in writing and can only be accepted every half term. If you need to make changes during the term the extra hours will be charged. Funded hours are allocated to cover the hours your child attends every week for the term. Any extra hours needed at short notice can be accommodated where possible, but will be charged.

<u>Allergies</u>

Can we remind parents that we have a few families with nut allergies, so please can we make sure that no nuts are brought in any lunchboxes, including peanut butter, pesto pasta, chocolate hazelnut spread etc.

Head Lice

From time to time these unwelcome visitors are found in the hair of children and adults.

Head lice are small wingless insects which only live on the human head and can only be passed on by direct head to head contact. Clean hair is no protection, although regular (weekly) hair washing and combing sessions offer a good opportunity to detect head lice and to arrange treatment, if discovered. Parents have the prime responsibility for checking their children's hair and carrying out treatment.

Head lice cannot fly, jump or swim.

An adult louse is 3.5mm in size. Anything smaller is a baby louse.

Head lice live on the hair. Adult head lice pass from one head to another during close contact.

When the baby louse hatches it leaves behind an empty white egg case this is called a nit.

Nits are not real head lice; there is no need to worry about them.

Adult head lice spread easily. All family members and other close contacts can carry head lice without knowing.

Everyone must check their hair weekly.

It can be up to 3 months before symptoms such as itching can occur.

School nurses (who are part of the NHS and not employed by the school) no longer carry out routine hair inspections, because this was not considered to be an effective method of monitoring and combating infestation. Where live lice are seen, teachers should notify the parent of the child concerned.

How to find Head Lice:

- 1. Wash hair well with shampoo and rinse
- 2. Use conditioner (makes hair slippery lice cannot hold on)
- 3. Comb hair from the roots to the ends with the detection comb.
- 4. Clear the comb of lice after each stroke.
- 5. Continue until the whole head is combed clear of lice.
- 6. Rinse off conditioner. Repeat at least weekly or after every hair wash.

Check all other close contacts immediately.

Repeat steps 1-6 every 3 days for 2 weeks

If after 2 weeks lice are still being found continue steps 1-6 until no more lice are seen.

Please do let the school know if you discover infestations at any time so that we can take steps to deal with the matter. Please treat your child before sending him/her back to school.

You can obtain lotions and shampoos from the chemists or try the above method as suggested by Bath & North East Somerset Council.
