## Learning in Year 6

This term, the children of year 6 have been researching, designing and building earthquakeproof buildings in D&T. This has linked to their learning in geography, which has focused on tectonic disasters. In the research stage, the children found out about the different features of earthquake-proof buildings, including cross bracing, sheer cores, rubberised foundations and base isolators.

Furthermore, they discovered that earthquakeproof buildings are often triangular-shaped, similar



to the pagodas of earthquake-prone Japan. The children had specific criteria to fulfill for their design, including a minimum of two storeys and a minimum total height of 30cm. To test the quality of their final products, we will simulate an earthquake (using a custom-made wobble board!). Fingers crossed the structures stay intact!
