Learning in Year 5



Following the completion of their assessments, the Year 5 children have massively enjoyed continuing their foundation learning. It has been a jam-packed week filled with World Book Day fun, freeze frames, role play and so much more!

Within both Rowan and Pine class, the Year 5 children have learned all about the work that goes into supplying the products that they have come to consume or use on a daily basis. In Geography lessons, the children worked incredibly hard to produce detailed flow diagrams to represent the supply chain for the Apple iPhone - a device that is now famously high in demand across the globe. The children were very interested in the many roles that exist within the supply chain - including those within the quaternary sector such as research and product innovation!



In efforts to experience the true essence of 'research and innovation', the children have since worked in groups to research, produce and further develop recipes in their design and technology lessons. Together, Year 5 produced a variety of baked focaccia breads each tailored to meet the needs and desires of their target audiences. Many of the children agreed that they had perhaps been a little heavy handed with ingredients such as salt and would next time alter their ingredient amounts to improve upon their recipe!

Another highlight of our learning this week has been Forest School whereby Pine class collaborated in designing theatre props out of the natural forest materials to inspire play and drama within the forest. The children left Miss. Drew and Mrs. Waterson amazed with their outstanding efforts to create.

Midsomer Norton Girls Team played their first match on Saturday and Jess (Willow class) was player of the team.





