## Message from the Headteacher

This week the children have been involved in British Science Week. The week started with an assembly from Mike who is an architect. He talked to the children about how science relates to his everyday work. Throughout the week the children focussed on scientists related to their science theme of the term with Year 1 focussing on Chester Greenwood linked to their materials topic, Year 2 looking at the work of Agnes Arber linked to their plants topic and Year 4 investigating the work of Nikola Tesla linked to their electricity work. On Thursday the children had another STEM ambassador visit with Matthew presenting his work on the COVID vaccinations and lego models. The week culminated with our STEM fair where we had over 50 entries - thank you for all of your support in helping the children to create such impressive projects. 






# Parent Survey Results

In order to raise this money, the school council will be holding a cake sale after school on Earth Day. We warmly welcome you to purchase a cake, which will cost 50p.
