Back here at school, the school council has continued to work hard to promote our energy saving efforts. They met with 'Bath and West Community Energy' company to discuss the installation of our solar panels in the Easter holidays and the part they are playing in helping our school to save energy. This week we have introduced a 'switch off afternoon' every Friday whereby all non essential electronics are turned off. The school council will monitor our weekly usage using the energy sparks website to see the impact this has on our energy usage.

On Wednesday Rowan class had their turn in completing their geography fieldwork on the Hlah Street, finding out the local residents' views on Fair Trade. And on Thursday Mr Cracknell took a group of Year 4 children to an inclusive multi skills festival at the cricket club. He was impressed with their engagement and perseverance across a range of activity stations.

A huge thank you to Natalie Stevens and Gemma Hand for giving up their time to dig over our vegetable beds. The children are looking forward to getting them planted up ready for the summer. If you have any seeds that you would like to donate they would be gratefully received.

#### School Council Eco Update

Yesterday, the school council were visited by two representatives of Bath & West Community Energy (BWCE), which is the company that installed our solar panels during the Easter holidays. The visitors travelled to our school by bus in the spirit of sustainability and spoke to our children about renewable energy and why it is important.

Our solar panels are difficult to spot because they are on a flat roof. Nevertheless, you can catch a glimpse of them from the reception playground. We have 93 in total and they will be able to meet 28.4% of our energy needs.



In other eco-news, a few members of our school council had a meeting this week with our caretaker, Natalie. They had many questions for her about energy efficiency in terms of our school's insulation, water, lighting and heating. These were the children's main findings:

- This year, we have had some new hot water tanks installed. These are much more efficient than the old ones and are therefore helping us to reduce the amount of gas that we use.
   We do still have some old water tanks, which waste energy, so we are hoping that we can eventually get these changed too.
- We have installed flush valves in many of the toilets to save water.
- Whenever a light is replaced, a more efficient LED light is installed. Natalie will be having a look around the older parts of the school (near the year 5 and 6 classrooms) to check where older lights could be replaced by more efficient LED lights.
- Our heating has been turned off since the Easter holidays.
- Our heating settings are now being reviewed more often and boilers are no longer being left on during the school holidays and weekends.

In terms of an area for improvement, the school council have suggested that we install motion sensors, which would switch lights off when an area is not in use.

The school council would also like to politely suggest that at home, you might have a review of your own energy efficiency. Is there something you could do to improve insulation? What could you do to reduce water consumption? What small changes could you make to reduce your electricity bill? Every small change can make a big difference!



#### RotaKids - Summer Fete Appeal

At this year's summer fete, the Rotakids will be holding a stall selling second-hand books and second -hand clothes. # Year 5 Geography Field Trip

This week, Rowan Class (year 5) have had their turn to embark upon some geography fieldwork. Just like Pine Class did last term, the children of Rowan have been out in Midsomer Norton to determine what local people think about Fair Trade. The children were well equipped for their investigation, having already collected data that compared Fair Trade products with their non-Fair Trade equivalents, and had this ready to share with the public.

The children discovered that local people recognise the value of Fair Trade and the important role it plays in spreading wealth more fairly around the world. At the same time, however, most of the people that the children spoke to stated that they are currently more likely to choose cheaper alternatives, rather than purchasing Fair Trade goods, due to the current 'cost of living crisis.'

In reflection, the children were all in agreement that our supermarkets should make it easier for us to make ethical shopping choices whilst also keeping to our tight budgets!
