#### Message from the Headteacher

As we begin to wrap up the 2022-2023 academic year, I wanted to take a moment to reflect on the fantastic week we've had at St John's.

Across the school we have enjoyed Art Week. The children have focussed on the work of Henri Rousseau and 'Surprise'. There is such a variety in how different classes have interpreted and appreciated the art and I hope you will join us in the studio on Monday after school to view the amazing work the children have been involved in.

Year 2 brought their learning on the Great Fire of London to a close with a visit from the fire service. #### Acorns & Year 1 Noah's Ark Visit


