Dear Parents / Carers

#### Attendance

We have put considerable care and effort into ensuring that our curriculum is carefully sequenced, building on learning year on year from age 2 to 11 years, with frequent recall of prior learning so that children can make links between and within subjects. Each and every lesson is also carefully sequenced. I cannot overstate the importance of ensuring that your child attends school as much as possible; one lesson missed can impact their success with future learning. I am not able to authorise any holiday during term time except in exceptional circumstances. Children are negatively impacted; they are frequently distracted (and can distract others) in the days before they go on holiday and then are on catch up on their return as they have not participated in preceding lessons. #### Parking on site

We have very limited parking on site and we also wish to minimise vehicles for the safety of children. Only vehicles with a valid disabled blue badge should be parked on site and then only if the person for whom it has been issued is present. Unless arrangements have been made with the Headteacher for a specific reason at a specific time, parents/carers should park outside the school grounds and walk to collect their child.

#### Final Notes

Please note: Monday 30th October is an INSET day so the children do not return until Tuesday 31th. This is Halloween but school uniform is required as normal. All clubs re-start the first week back.

As the clocks will be changing and the nights getting darker earlier, no child will be permitted to walk home alone following an after school club from Term 2 onwards. This also applies to Year 6.
