## Dear Parents,

I have been really pleased with the way the Year 6 children have settled back into class this academic year. They have worked hard and been keen to impress the adults in class. Term 2 is always actionpacked with additional Christmas events, however, there will still be plenty of time for learning. Mr Morgan, who is a Bath Spa Trainee, will continue to teach some lessons this term. During week 2, the children will be assessed using a previous set of SATs papers; this will allow me to identify where the children are and any gaps they may have.

In **Maths** this term we will be continuing where we left with fractions (2 weeks). Next we will learn about converting units (1 week) and finally moving onto ratio (2 weeks). We use the White Rose Maths scheme which breaks the learning down into small steps and lessons are taught in a very logical sequence. This allows the children to build on their prior learning throughout the weeks, terms and years. Here are the small steps (objectives):

Our **writing** this term will focus on the skills of writing narratives. We will first use a picture book called 'Varmints' as our inspiration and practise using the following skills: relative clauses to add information; short sentences; personification; passive voice; simile and metaphor. Later on in the term we will use part of the film 'Titanic' to inspire diary entries. Finally the children will write, publish and illustrate Christmas stories.

The punctuation and grammar covered this term will be: the possessive apostrophe and relative clauses.

Our class text will be 'The Firework-Maker's Daughter' by Philip Pullman.

Science	Energy: Light and Reflection	Exploring how light travels in straight lines and how this explains observations of shadows and reflection, while using mirrors and shadows to measure light sources.
Geography	South America	Learning about the cultures, biomes, and climate of various countries across South America and how this differs compared to Europe and the UK.
PE	Netball Gymnastics	Passing and shooting techniques; match play and tactics. Using balances and counter balances; forward and backward rolls; create sequences for performances.
Computing	Creating Media - 3D Modelling	Developing knowledge and understanding of using a computer to produce 3D models and becoming familiar with working, moving, resizing, and duplicating objects in a 3D space.
RE	Agape	Exploring the meaning of 'agape' (the highest form of love) and using it to learn about the Beatitudes in the Bible and how Jesus' sermons are used by Christians today.
DT	Textiles: Waistcoats	Designing a waistcoat in accordance with a specification and design criteria to fit a specific theme, annotating designs, and using fabric accurately.
PSHE	Celebrating Difference	Understanding that everyone is different and learning about how best to include others regardless of differences and celebrate what makes us unique.
Music	Classroom Jazz	Listening to and appraising jazz music and using our understanding of musical terms to improvise alongside musical tracks.
French	Let's Go Shopping	Teaching key vocabulary and phrases connected to going shopping in French, reinforcing basic grammar rules, including how to use the verb 'faire' (to do), and discovering what a French shopping experience is like.

Weekly spellings are set on a Friday and tested the following Friday. The children will have the whole term's spellings already stuck in their spelling books. They should fill a double page with practice which they can do throughout the week at home using a range of strategies (see the front of their spelling book for ideas). Homework will vary between SPaG.com and arithmetic papers. I will send an example arithmetic paper so that you can support your child in completing this homework. The children should be using Doodle Maths and Doodle Tables several times a week as well.

We will be using the new Accelerated Reader programme which ensures that children are reading books which are appropriate to their ability. Mr Griffith and I also keep a close eye on the books the children are reading and we expect to see them progressing through a variety of books throughout the year. We have a fully stocked bookshelf full of high-quality texts for them to choose from.















Please do not hesitate to come and see me if you have any questions or queries. I believe a strong teacher-parent relationship is essential to ensure your child makes the most progress they can. I also know that a happy child who feels safe and cared for at school will make the most of their days so please keep me informed of any changes you feel may affect their well-being.
