Personal Development:



Children's Mental Health Week will be explored in class from week commencing 5th February. This year, the theme is 'My Voice Matters'. The children will be learning about how they can make their voices heard and why it can make a difference. On the 6th of February, it is safer Internet Day. As a school, we understand that it can be difficult monitoring your child's online usage. However, please can you remain alert in order to safeguard them on both social media and games with recommended ages. Apps like Qustodio and Google Family Link can be a helpful tool to support this

Supporting home learning

Please remember also the importance of hearing younger and less confident children read aloud to an adult at least three times a week. Furthermore, it is important to share stories with children (even older, independent readers); as this can open opportunities to discover new vocabulary and challenge comprehension. If you would like further support with home learning, please do not hesitate to speak to your child's teacher.
