This week, Year Six finished off their WWII History topic with a trip to STEAM Swindon - Museum of the Great Western Railway.


They took part in two WWII Discovery Sessions (experiencing life as an evacuee in 1939 and exploring public air raid shelters) and toured the museum to see how the railway services were affected by the war.











DIY Bug Hotel

As part of the Rota Kids Club this term we are looking to expand our school community with some creepy, crawly critters! We will be designing and constructing a bug hotel which will be based on Zone 5 near the forest area. Before we can get started, we need your help!

As a club we are passionate about keeping our environment clean and reducing waste so we are looking for any spare materials you may want to recycle and donate to this wonderful wormy cause.



What we need:

• Dead wood. This is essential for the larvae of wood-boring beetles.

• Hollow stems. Hollow stems, such as old bamboo canes, make good nesting sites for solitary bees.

• **Stones and tiles.** Amphibians need a frost-free place to spend the winter. Providing stones and tiles in the centre of our habitat will give amphibians the cool, damp conditions they need.

• Straw and hay. These provide many opportunities for invertebrates to burrow

• Corrugated cardboard. Rolled up pieces of corrugated cardboard in a waterproof cylinder creates a home for lacewings.

• **Nectar-producing plants.** Nectar-rich flowers such as Aubretia, Bluebell, Clover, Cuckooflower, Daisy, Dandelion, Forget-me-not, Honesty, Pansy, Primrose, Sweet Rocket and Wallflower provide excellent food for butterflies.

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Support for families and young people with special educational needs and/or Disabilities (SEND).

Explore the SEND Local Offer to find out what support there is available for young people with SEND and their families. Live Well B&NES includes details of wellbeing groups, social clubs, inclusive activities, holiday clubs, mental health support services and opportunities beyond formal education.

Dedicated information sections signpost to support around benefits and funding, Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCP's), health services and how to access impartial advice and guidance from specialist teams.

Parent Carers of young people with SEND can identify ways they can access support for their role as a parent **carer** of a child with additional needs.

You can also apply for your child's free Rainbow Resource card providing discreet confirmation of their additional need, and enabling them to access dedicated activity sessions, quiet spaces and support, and in some cases concessions to venues across the South West.
