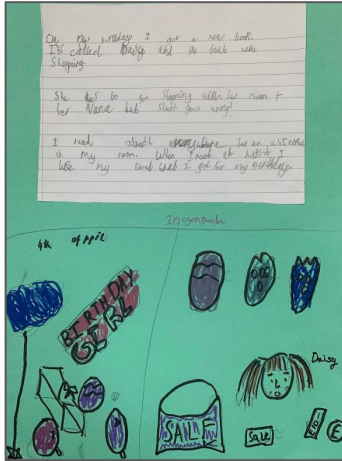
## Out of School Achievement



Well done to Nyla who was chosen to attend Cardiff Metropolitan Sports University to take part in the Bath Cheerleading competition.

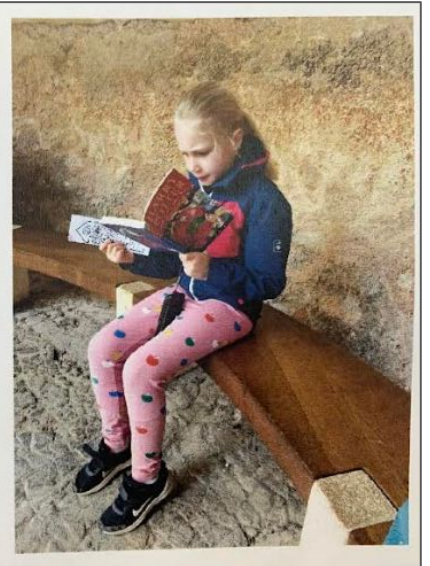
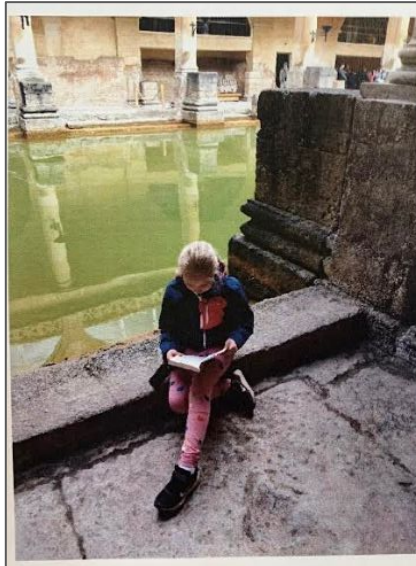


## Reading in Year Three
