

* Layla's parents have provided us with some information on the charity Reverse Rett to help us to better understand what the charity means to them. The charity has provided them with first hand support, as well as funding for the CIPP centre specialist hospital where Layla has received care. Layla's family are also very open to answering questions about Rett syndrome, as raising awareness is very important to them.

What is gene therapy?

"The concept behind gene therapy is simple: deliver healthy genes to compensate for mutated ***** genes (RSRT, 2022)."

At time of writing, two biotech companies, Taysha Gene Therapies and Neurogene are collectively running clinical trials across Canada and the US, Australia and now right here in the ** UK. In Spring 2023, Taysha broke ground, dosing the first Rett patient in history with gene therapy. Since then, both companies have reported significant global improvement in both adult and paediatric patients on a low dose level. Updates of the trails are available on their websites, and Reverse Rett will share announcements of the data as and when it is released."

Reverse Rett:

Our vision

We want a world where children with Rett syndrome are diagnosed quicker, earlier, and more effectively than they are right now. A world where much more is known about the condition and factors that affect progression. A world where at every stage of development, treatments are available to counteract its symptoms. A world where we ultimately deliver a cure and enable people with Rett Syndrome to lead free and healthy lives.

What We Do:

- Over the last fourteen years, we've invested in high-quality research projects such as the RSRT Gene Therapy and MECP2 Consortia, which have led to the gene therapy programs in clinical trials today.
- We run the UK's patient registry for Rett syndrome: Rett Registry UK and work to facilitate UK clinical trials of emerging treatments.
- We provide core funding for the national specialist CIPP Rett Centre based at the Maudsley Hospital in London.
- We provide families with health information and resources and help connect them to UK Rett syndrome clinics.
- We host an annual educational conference for families, caregivers, researchers and health care professionals.
- We provide online workshops and up-to-date information via our website, social media platforms and one to one contact with families.

We advocate for treatment for Rett syndrome nationally and internationally.



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
