Earlier in the week, we'll be relaunching DoodleMaths with the children. Thursday's workshop will give you a helpful overview of what they've been introduced to and how you can get involved.

Sports Day will last all day for the children with each Key Stage taking part in different sports. Parents are welcome to attend the track events as normal but we ask that you stay down the bottom of the field by the car park and that you do not go to the top end of the field where the field events are taking place; where you can sit and watch will be marked out by Respect Line tape.

Key Stage Two (Years 3 to 6) track events will begin at 9am and EYFS and Key Stage One (Years Rec to 2) track events will begin at 1.15pm.

For the Key Stage 2 track events, parents are welcome to enter the field from 8:45am and will need to exit before lunchtime at 11.45am. For Key Stage 1 track events, parents are welcome to enter the field from 1pm.

Sports Day will start for all children at 9am with one of the key stages taking part in field events, while the other key stage takes part in the track events. There will be break times throughout the morning, where the children will return inside for a break. In the afternoon the key stages will take part in events that they didn't complete in the morning.

The children will need to have a sunhat, drink bottle and be topped up with suncream on the day in case of sunshine, and to be sent in with some warm clothing if the weather is due to be cooler than we have had recently. Children will need to come to school dressed in their house colour. The children will be reminded of their house colour.

For lunch, the children with packed lunches will eat their lunch on the field whilst the children who have school dinners will remain having their lunch in the dinner hall. If you have already booked a school dinner but your child would prefer a packed lunch, please adjust your booking on Parent Pay.


Reading in Year Five

This book is a beautiful illustrated information text all about what we can do to look after our planet.


We have enjoyed using the pictures to support our comprehension and in science we made posters all about environmentalism linked to our Guided Reading topic!



Reading in Year Six

In Year Six, our final class reader of the school year is 'Kensuke's Kingdom' by Michael Morpurgo. This is a story about a boy, named Michael, who is shipwrecked on a remote island and forms an unlikely friendship with a Japanese man named Kensuke.

The story explores themes of survival and friendship, as well as cultural understanding as Michael and Kensuke learn to better-understand and respect one another. Furthermore, given that Kensuke has lived on the island ever since World War II, the story has lots of valuable links with some of our learning from the past year.
