
We look forward to hearing all about these books as the children explore them further both inside and outside of school!

Watch a Roald Dahl Adaptation


- · Watch a child-friendly film or animated adaptation of a Roald Dahl book together.

- · This supports literacy and vocabulary development in a fun way.


