
The next sessions, which all commence at 9.30am, will be held on:

Whether your child is new to the sport, or an experienced player, our sports clubs provide an environment that is engaging for all.



Reading in Year Five



Year Five have had a fantastic week of reading, with plenty of enthusiasm and engagement on display!

In our Guided Reading lessons, we've continued diving into Anglo-Saxon Boy by Tony Bradman. This exciting historical novel has helped us explore the lives of the Anglo-Saxons through the eyes of Magnus, the protagonist (main character). We've been sharpening our retrieval and inference skills as we dig deeper into the plot, asking thoughtful questions and backing up our answers with evidence from the text.

Last week, we also celebrated Roald Dahl Day with a lively reading and performance of The Lion, a humorous poem from Dahl's Dirty Beasts collection. Year Five threw themselves into the challenge, working on their volume, pace, and expression to bring the poem to life. It was a joy to see their confidence grow as they explored how voice can shape the meaning and mood of a piece.

At St John's our Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Coordinator (SENDCo) is Mrs Monks.



If you have any questions or concerns about your child, your first point of contact is always their class teacher but, I can be contacted via the school office if you would like to meet with me directly.

Over the last couple of weeks your child's teacher has been getting to know them and working with them to determine how best to support them.

If your child is on the SEND register, over the next week they will bring home their Individual Support Plan (ISP).

Please contact the school office if you have not received this by Friday 26th September.

A SEND Individual Support Plan (ISP) is a personalised document designed to outline the specific special educational needs of your child and the tailored support they will receive to help them succeed. It identifies their strengths, areas of need, and the strategies or interventions that will be used to support their learning and development.

This plan ensures that support is targeted, consistent, and regularly reviewed, enabling your child to make progress academically, socially, and emotionally within the school environment.

There will be a chance to review and discuss this ISP at our October parent's evening appointments.




