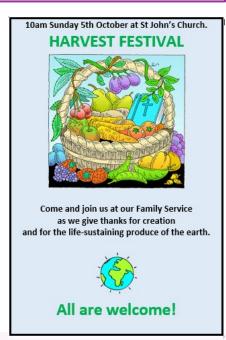

Message from our House Captains

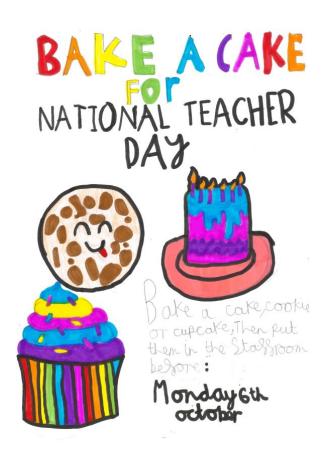
Next Monday, we'll be celebrating National Teacher Day – a special chance to say thank you to all the wonderful teachers and staff who work so hard for our children every dav.

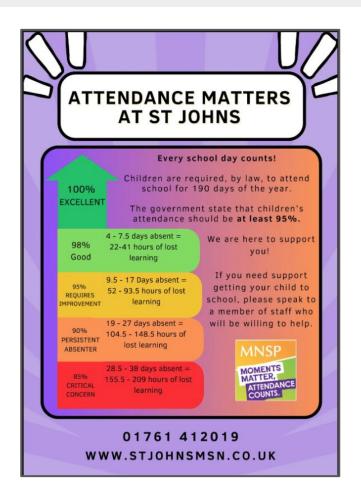

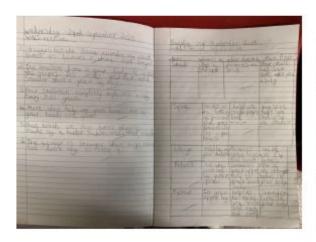


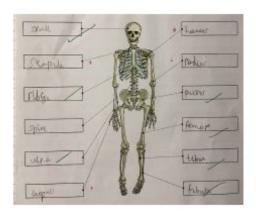




Reading in Year Three

This term, Year 3 is exploring the fascinating topic of skeletons and how we move. Through hands-on activities, discussions, and investigations, the children are learning about the different types of skeletons, the names and functions of key bones in the human body, and how our muscles and joints work together to help us move. This science topic links directly to our English work, where the children are beginning to write their own non-chronological reports all about skeletons. They will be using facts they've learned in their Guided Reading sessions to organise their writing, use technical vocabulary, and present information clearly and accurately. It's a great opportunity for them to connect their learning across subjects and develop both their knowledge and writing skills.

We are so proud of each and every runner.













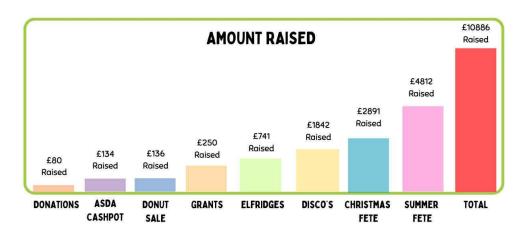
