During Term 2 there is lots of exciting learning for us to enjoy. Here's what we will be doing:

Our class reads:

This Term we are reading ***The Wild Robot*** By Peter Brown. Some of you may have been to see the film adaptation which is on at the cinema. A heartwarming and action-packed novel about what happens when nature and technology collide. This book is full of humour, drama and emotion. It'll be my first time reading it and I'm so looking forward to it.

We will also be reading one of my favourite books, ***The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane*** By Kate DiCamillo. *Abilene loves her blue china rabbit, but Edward Tulane is extremely vain and only loves himself. On a voyage from New York to London, Edward falls overboard and from there finds himself on an amazing journey where he finally learns what it is to truly love.*

In addition to the above books, we will be enjoying a book called, ***A River*** by Marc Martin which will complement our Geography topic on Rivers. It is a beautiful geographical story with lush landscapes and poetic text from an award-winning Australian illustrator.

Write Stuff:

We begin our Write Stuff lessons with a focus on **poetry**. This unit is full of description and imagination. You'll love it!

Having written your own poems, you will go on to story writing (narratives). These will be based on a beautiful book by Sam Hay called, ***Star in a Jar***. Your persuasive writing last term was just wonderful and I'm sure you will be just as proud of these stories too.

Maths:

We will be continuing with our **Addition and Subtraction** learning before focusing on **Multiplication and Division**.

Science:

We will be working scientifically to learn about **Forces and Magnets**. This will involve describing the effects of contact forces (pulls, pushes and twists); recognising and investigating the effects and uses of friction; describing and investigating the effects of magnets and explaining their uses.

Geography:

Our first Geography unit in Badger Class is an exciting topic: Rivers; what they are and how they are used. There might even be a trip to our local river to see some of the features that we have discussed in class, weather permitting!

Art:

We will be exploring **3D Art and Sculpture**

RE:

We are continuing to study **Christianity**.

PE:

Swimming will continue in this Term. (This will be the final term of swimming this academic year.)

Music:

In Music, we will be playing **Glockenspiels**.

Jigsaw:

Celebrating Difference: this term's puzzle is all about accepting and celebrating the differences between us all. We will be celebrating anti-bullying week in week 2 and focusing our thoughts about bullying in our Jigsaw lessons.

French:

In French, our theme is **All About Me**. This includes classroom instructions, colours, parts of the body, clothes and actions.

NFERs:

In weeks 1 and 2 we will be completing the Assessment Papers: Spelling; Punctuation and Grammar; Maths and Reading. This is nothing to worry about; they're used by me so that I can see what we need to concentrate on in our learning.

Christmas:

We have many special activities planned to celebrate this special time of year,

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including:

As you are aware, Badger Class have been invited to take part in this delightful event which will take place after school at Holy Trinity Church in Paulton on **Thursday 27th November 4.30-5.30**.
