

<u>'Wear Red' Non-Uniform day for the Poppy Appeal - Tuesday 11th November</u>





Appropriate Weather-proof Clothing / Footwear

As the weather becomes more wintery, please can all parents and carers ensure that their children are provided with an appropriate, weather proof coat **every day in school.** There are a number of children arriving each day without appropriate outdoor coats. The children will play outside at breaktime and lunchtime every day in all weathers (unless particularly bad), so will always require a coat.

Items available include poppies, slap bands, rulers, lanyards, and lots more. All items are available **for a donation**, with all proceeds going to the Poppy Appeal.






Wreath Making – Wednesday 3rd December – 6pm – 9pm


