How does this help when choosing a job?

Labour Market Information (LMI) is information about what is happening in a labour market. LMI tends to focus on the industries that are growing and declining. It provides information about the types and levels of jobs and the skills required and whether they are increasing or decreasing. Labour Market Information (LMI) is a useful tool to help research future jobs in the local area, understand the skills needed for certain roles and the demand for future employment.

In the 2021 Census it showed that 27.8m people aged 16 years and over said they were in employment. The top 10 most common jobs were;

- Sales & retail
- Care workers & home workers
- Cleaners
- Administrative occupations
- Warehouse operatives
- Managers & directors in retail
- Other nursing professionals
- Financial managers & directors
- Secondary education teaching professionals
- Kitchen & catering assistants

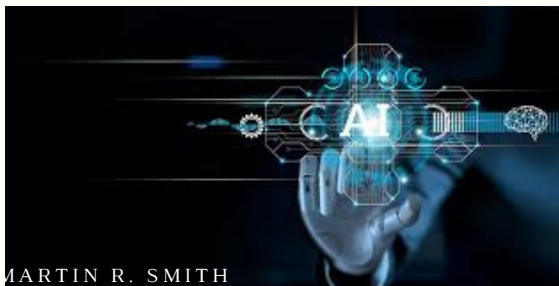
