What options are out there?

Sometimes it's hard to know where to even start!

Lots of us know what A-levels are, even if we know we don't want to do them, but what about T-levels, apprenticeships, technical, vocation and applied courses?

Here's a brief run-down of what things you can do after you leave school:

A-levels

Like GCSEs but fewer subjects and in more detail. You choose what you'd like to do and continue with classroom based learning for two years, then you sit exams.

Some subjects available: Maths, English Literature, Law, Sociology, Physics, Photography, Drama, German

T-levels

A new type of qualification designed alongside employers to give you all you need to get on in the workplace. Combines classroom learning with industrial placements. Doing 1 T-level is equivalent to doing 3 A-levels.

Some subjects available: Health, Digital Design, Science, Computing, Digital business

Technical, vocational and applied courses

These qualifications teach you things you need to know for the role/career that you want to pursue. They cover a wide range of subjects and levels of study so it's very flexible. These courses often combine classroom learning and practical aspects to suit the course you're following. Like T-levels, doing one of these courses can be equivalent to doing A-levels if you're studying at level 3. Level 2 courses are more equivalent to GCSEs whereas level 1 courses are foundation level. When you're picking your course, think about what level suits you best.

Apprenticeship

Doing an apprenticeship combines learning and working. You are part of a workplace, doing a job and getting paid for it whilst also being trained. You'll spend a certain amount of time and work and then some days a week at college or your training provider. You can do apprenticeships at a variety of levels too, from intermediate (which is equivalent to 5 GCSEs grades 9-4) all the way through to degree level apprenticeships. To do an apprenticeship you can either apply directly to a company with an available place (check out https://www.findapprentices hip.service.gov.uk/) or apply to a college and they'll work with you to find a company.
