

Provider Access Policy for Careers Delivery and Guidance

This policy sets out the academy's arrangements for managing the access of careers providers to students at Buckler's Mead Academy for the purpose of giving information and guidance about the education and training on offer, both in the local area and nationally. This complies with the Academy's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997 and is in line with the more recent Government Careers Strategy published in December 2017.

Pupil entitlement

All pupils in years 8-11 are entitled

- To find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeships opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point;
- To hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships- through options events, assemblies, group discussions and performances, taster events and careers fairs;
- To understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses as well as how to search and apply for apprenticeships.
