Larger school, small feel

With over 400 pupils on roll and 60 pupils in our nursery, it might seem like St John's is a large and overwhelming environment for a young child. However, we are very proud of the exemplary relationships between pupils and staff and individual attention that children receive. All who visit our school note how at ease and confident our pupils are. In the Early Years, high levels of staffing ensures that children have the support that they need to get off to a flying start. Our Ofsted inspection of 2016 stated that 'staff are excellent role models for pupils' and praised our 'community spirit'.

Church links and values

As a Voluntary Aided primary school founded by the Church of England, Christian values are at the heart of all we do. Children take part in daily worship, visit St John's Church regularly, and in Key Stage 2 attend Anglican mass every term.

Our church school inspection in 2015 judged the school's effectiveness to be 'Outstanding' in all areas.



Pastoral Care and Safeguarding

Our school takes the safeguarding of

pupils seriously. The safeguarding message threads through all aspects of our work, from how we employ new staff to children playing on the playground. We strongly believe in fostering an atmosphere of respect and mutual support to help children to be the best they can be. We listen to children and keep them safe.

Finding the Star in Everyone

We believe that primary school should give pupils experiences to help them know their favourite subjects, strengths and future ambitions. As a result, we offer a broad and enriched curriculum where children receive opportunities to develop artistically, creatively, scientifically and physically as well as academically. We offer high quality teaching and enrichment weeks for Art, Drama and Sport, as well as opportunities to access specialist teachers in partnership with local secondary schools.

Parent Partnerships

We can't do this without you! You and your child are very important to us. You will be invited into school to share your child's achievements once a term for 'Learning Celebrations' and to see your children's assemblies, plays and sporting events. Our staff are highly visible at the start and end of day and we welcome your feedback through our 'Parent Forum' and Ethos committee.


Breakfast Club

We run a breakfast club from 7.30am which provides a safe and nurturing environment for your child. A healthy breakfast choice is available including cereals, toast, fruit juice and milk. The club runs Monday to Friday during term time and we are able to take children from Nursery to Year 6. The cost of the club is £2.50 per session (7.30am – 8.30am).

School meals

Children have the choice of being able to bring a packed lunch or purchase a healthy and nutritious school dinner. School dinners are cooked on-site in our school kitchen.

We have a School Council made up of class representatives who meet regularly with the Headteacher and other staff to discuss pupil's views and provide feedback on current issues.





Curriculum

What we teach

Our curriculum covers the essential knowledge and skills of the National Curriculum 2014 and the Early Years Foundation Stage. We tailor our curriculum to the needs and interests of pupils and we have adopted a number of innovative learning programmes, such as the Singapore approach to mathematics teaching and the highly praised "Jigsaw" curriculum for personal, social and health education. We follow highly structured approaches to the teaching of phonics, reading, handwriting and spelling.




Beyond the classroom

The curriculum extends beyond traditional learning in lessons. We offer every class the opportunity to take part in 'Forest School' sessions which help children not only to enjoy our wonderful forest but to learn collaboratively, take risks and challenge themselves physically. Our trained forest school leader plans sessions which enrich children's classroom topics. They love it!

Learning for Life- "Achievosaurs"

We use these little creatures to teach children the learning attitudes and behaviours that will help them to be successful. They include being an "Askoraptor" by being curious, and a "Tryatops" by showing resilience.

Lunchtime Provision

Recognising the importance of play in children's lives, we have worked hard to promote positive and quality play opportunities and have transformed the lunchtime period with our introduction of the zoned areas which the children sign up for each day.



Zone 1: The front playground provides creative play opportunities linked to role play, imaginative story-telling, music and performance.

Zone 2: The field provides the open space necessary for children to let off steam, develop physical skills and refine sporting techniques. This is a zone where future sports people develop their craft!

Zone 3: The middle playground promotes the development of large motor skills with the use of balls, racquets, hoops, skipping ropes and various other items of equipment. This is where the Huff & Puff trolley can be accessed and a range of physical skills can be practised and refined.



Zone 4: A smaller zone catering for quieter activities such as drawing, model making, garden games and small world play.

Zone 5: Here loose parts, supplied by the scrap store, can be used to develop imaginative play and water is a regular and popular feature for children to become engaged with.



Early Years Foundation Stage

The Principles of 'The Early Years Foundation Stage' are:

- Every child is a <u>unique child</u>, who is constantly learning and can be resilient, capable, confident and self assured
- Children learn to be strong and independent through the development of <u>positive relationships</u>
- Children learn and develop well in <u>enabling environments</u>, where their experiences respond to individual needs
- Children develop and learn in different ways and at different rates

These principles underpin our everyday practice in Reception at St John's.

Opportunities

Forest School

Forest School at St John's is a fully inclusive, holistic approach to learning which helps our children reach their full potential. In all weathers and through all seasons, we will explore our naturally stunning environment with an aim to build confidence and resilience in, and curiosity about, the world around them.



Cooking

We are extremely lucky to have a large dedicated cookery room and all pupils have a termly cookery slot, which includes teaching about the importance of a balanced diet and healthy lifestyles.

Trips

Here at St. John's we are committed to providing the best educational opportunities for all our pupils. We believe that school trips can provide a real stimulus for class based learning and bring subjects to life..

Examples of trips include:

An EYFS local walk and supermarket visit Midsomer Norton Railway Carymoor Environmental Centre Longleat Pilgrim Day at Wells Cathedral Roman Baths Midsomer Norton Nature Reserve We The Curious, Bristol Places of Worship for other faiths.



Residentials

We also offer residential trips for our Year 4 and Year 6 pupils. These trips foster independence, team work, communication, community spirit, improved social interactions, and help build relationships.

Other Opportunities

Young Voices at the O2:

Each year we provide the opportunity for our school choir to be involved in a choir of over 7500 children. After months practice the children attend the Young Voices concert at the O2.

Dance Umbrella:

The Dance Umbrella is the flagship event of the Bath & North East Somerset School Sport Partnership. It brings together young people from across the authority in a celebration of dance and movement. The event provides pupils with the opportunity to perform in front of a live audience in the impressive backdrop of the Bath Forum.

Special Educational Needs

At St John's, we strive to support all our children and enable them to reach their full potential at school. In order to do this, many steps are taken to support them through their learning journey. Quality teaching is vital; however, for some children, there are occasions when further additional support may be needed to help them achieve their targets. This support may be for educational, emotional, behavioural or physical needs.

Provision for children with special educational needs is monitored closely and reviewed every term. The need for additional support or interventions is discussed with parents/carers to ensure there is mutual support for the child.

There are additional activities provided at lunchtime by lan Groves Sports, who are qualified coaches.



Sport clubs include football, netball, dance, tennis, gymnastics and rounders. We also offer tennis, golf, cricket, athletics, street dance, multi sports and many more...

GOLD Sports Mark Award

The School Games Mark is a government led awards scheme launched in 2012 to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community. We are very proud that St John's has achieved the Gold School Games Mark for our commitment, engagement and delivery of competitive school sport!

Other extra-curricular clubs include pottery, mindfulness and cooking.


Music

Admissions
